David Corbet and **Jacob Lehrer** have recently launched their new website, which can be viewed online at: http://www.davidandjacob.com

The website contains up to date information about performance-based projects, choreographic research, teaching and other events undertaken by Corbet and Lehrer. There are video clips of previous works and research as well as photographs of various projects. The site allows access to ongoing documentation of developing work and is intended to serve as a document for artistic reflection while allowing another entry point into their work for audiences. Another purpose is to allow ongoing documentation to become an integral part of their generative and performance process.

This year Corbet and Lehrer have been developing their dance work with the assistance of a residency from Culture Lab at the Meat Market in Melbourne. This residency has been spread across the beginning months of 2006. Their work continues their practice in real-time choreography and builds upon the material from **Excavate: a two man dig**, developed during a residency at the Australian Choreographic Centre in 2005.

Excavate touches on themes of relationship, history, intimacy and human nature. Using the analogy of an archaeological dig these two unique dance artists work with real-time choreography to brush away the layers and uncover a highly sophisticated piece that allows the audience to experience simplicity within complex structures.

Excavate was initially developed through a residency at the Australian Choreographic Centre in Canberra in August 2005. This May, Corbet and Lehrer continue with another major residency at the Centre that culminates in the premier season of **Excavate: a two man dig** as part of the Canberra Theatre Centre's Risky Manoeuvres subscription series. The season runs from May 16 - 20. This season precedes an International tour of the work towards the end of 2006, which will include performances in New York, Toronto, London and Paris.

David Corbet is a multidisciplinary artist. He has developed and created work as a musician, composer, dancer, choreographer, director and editor. His primary focus is on live performance using techniques in real time composition and choreography. He has worked regularly with choreographers Rosalind Crisp, Paul Romano, Simon Ellis, Felicity MacDonald and Shaun McLeod, both as a dancer and a composer/musician. He is a member of State of Flux, Two Suits, and The Boys. He edits and publishes Proximity magazine.

Jacob Lehrer works as a dancer, actor, director, writer, teacher and choreographer. In the performance arena he has worked with DV8(UK) Physical Theatre, Legs on the Wall, Strange Fruit International Outdoor Theatre Company, Sue Healey Company, Lucy Guerin, Born in a Taxi, State of Flux, Shelley Lasica, Nat Cursio and Shannon Bott.
